Instructor qualification October 2017

To qualify as a Motorcycle Instructor with ART motorcycle training you will need to first complete the instructor inset day. Once you have completed steps 1 – 5 we will then work with you to tailor a learning programme to suit both your needs and timetable.

1. Book Instructor inset day. Cost £39
2. Provide us with a copy of your C.V.
3. Complete the Instructor inset day. Duration 7 hours.
4. Initial “shadowing” day on a CBT course.
5. Complete an on road riding assessment with one of our senior staff. Duration 90 minutes.

If you are successful on both your inset day and on road riding assessment (this will be arranged after your inset day) we will then arrange training with one of our senior staff until you are ready to be issued a “Downtrained” Card (CBT1) this can take approximately 8 to 14 days before you are ready. This will take the form of “shadowing” on CBT courses and personal development.

You will then be required to take and pass the Motorcycle instructor theory test. Cost £66 (This can be done at the beginning of your training with us)

Once the motorcycle instructor theory test has been passed we will issue you with a CBT1 card. You can then teach CBT's for ART and be paid for your time. When you have reached this level you have to be assessed “in house” 4 times per year. In order to meet this requirement we expect you to be available for work with us for a minimum of 12 days per calendar year, again you will work under the supervision of senior ART staff.

After a further period of training and assessment we will send you to the National Driving Test Centre at DVSA Cardington. This is a two day assessment course and if successful you will be given a CBT1C Card. This will now mean you can conduct Roadrider courses for ART on the A1 (125cc) bikes.

(Any overnight expenses to be payable by you, the assessment itself is non chargeable)

When you have a little more experience with Roadrider courses we will then book you in for the “Direct Access” assessment course at DVSA Cardington. This is a 4 hour course and when successful you will gain the CBT1D card, meaning you are able to teach all sizes of motorcycle up to test standard.

When all three of the DVSA stages of motorcycle instructor have been achieved we will then start working with you on a programme to qualify as an E.R.S. instructor. This will involve a DVSA riding assessment and also teaching assessment with a senior DVSA examiner. Once complete you will then eligible to be on the R.P.M.T. (Register of Post Licence Motorcycle Trainers)

Our intention is not to charge for our training but instead you are expected to show a level of commitment and dedication and as such all training days are “non paid”. Our fee for training is £1,200, however, this fee will be waived and on the conditions that when you qualify with the company as an instructor, you are required to work a minimum of 12 days per calendar year (CBT1 card issue). If you do not meet these conditions or you choose not to work at ART then the £1,200 training fee will be payable in full by you. We only pay fuel costs when you are training students. You are expected to provide your own motorcycle, professional indemnity insurance whilst teaching and radio. Any equipment hire will be negotiated on an individual basis. You will be contracted on a freelance basis for all work.

To be eligible to begin training as a DVSA motorcycle instructor you will need to have held a full motorcycle licence for at least 3 years with no convictions and be a minimum of 21 years of age.
